Hasso Plattner's focus on innovation has guided his engagement across technology, art, and philanthropy.

As a co-founder of SAP in 1972, Prof. Dr. h.c. mult. Hasso Plattner played a defining role in software engineering. Under his leadership, SAP developed software that transformed how businesses manage their operations worldwide.

His striving for excellence is evident not only in his business approach but also in his philanthropic projects. Hasso Plattner's engagement in education is deeply personal, stemming from his gratitude towards public education, which played a key role in his achievements. This appreciation drove his determination to establish the Hasso Plattner Foundation in 2015.

The Beginnings

The Plattner family's philanthropy precedes the establishment of the Foundation. In 1998, Prof. Plattner founded the Hasso Plattner Institute (HPI) aiming to build a science hub in Potsdam. Today, HPI is a leading institute in digital engineering.

Hasso Plattner's patronage of the University of Cape Town began in 2003 with a six million Euro donation to the Isisombululo program, aiding youth health and education in South Africa. That same year, the Hasso Plattner Institute of Design at Stanford was founded, sparking a global movement in design thinking.

In 2005, Hasso and Sabine Plattner hosted the 46664 concert at Fancourt, South Africa, to raise awareness of HIV/AIDS, ensuring all ticket revenue went to the Nelson Mandela Foundation.

In 2008, Sabine Plattner launched an initiative to support the development of locally adapted educational resources for teachers across Africa under the umbrella of Sabine Plattner African Charities.

What started as an idea in the late 1990s became a clear commitment in 2015 when the Hasso Plattner Foundation was established as an ecosystem of philanthropic initiatives by the Plattner family.

Inspiring Generations, Shaping the Future

As we mark our tenth anniversary in 2025, we take a moment to reflect on the journey of the Hasso Plattner Foundation. Hasso Plattner's wish to make a lasting contribution to society led him to sign the Giving Pledge in 2013. He highlighted Germany's largely tuition-free education system which played a pivotal role in his success. "I want to give back to the society that made this possible," said Plattner upon establishing the Foundation in 2015, focusing its philanthropic initiatives on education.

Since then, the Foundation has enabled 50 projects across 20 countries, having disbursed approximately one billion Euro as philanthropic giving. Today, the Hasso Plattner Foundation is a diverse ecosystem supporting transformative projects in science and education, environmental conservation, and art.

Looking ahead, we remain committed to our mission of educating and inspiring generations. This work continues to be driven by a shared sense of purpose and an openness to change. Many thanks to our teams, project partners, and the communities they serve for their trust and collaboration. Together, we will continue building the Foundation's ecosystem in the next decade.

We are committed to inspiring the next generation of innovators, educators, and creators, equipping them with the skills and knowledge to make a meaningful difference in the world.

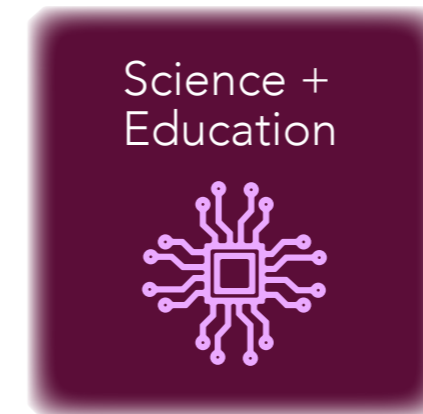

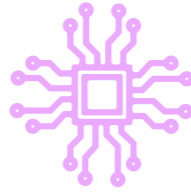

During the last years, our initiatives under the focus area of Science & Education contributed to the adoption of digital technologies. They did so by teaching design thinking approaches, establishing digital health partnerships, and building one of the leading institutes in digital engineering – the Hasso Plattner Institute (HPI).

Our Contribution

Digital sovereignty is a key factor for an economically stable, free, and self-determined European society. But Europe is lagging behind in the development of future technologies. Therefore, our focus is on educating young talents, advancing research, and supporting innovations in Europe. All our activities in the area of Science & Education promote Europe's digital sovereignty, with the Hasso Plattner Institute acting as a catalyst.

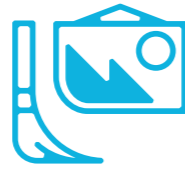

We view emerging technologies as enablers across our focus areas. Building on our founder's vision and our ecosystem, we move into our second decade with confidence and clarity of purpose.
